



## EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY

The Lac La Ronge Indian Band Education Department is now accepting applications for the following full-time **term** position for the 2018-2019 school year with the possibility of extension. This position will be based out of the La Ronge Band Office:

### SPEECH LANGUAGE PATHOLOGIST

The Speech Language Pathologist, under the direction of the Superintendent of Schools (Special Education), will primarily be responsible for providing speech language and audiology direct assessment and therapy for students to support phonological awareness and other speech and language challenges.

#### Duties (includes but not limited to):

- Provide training to staff regarding speech and language stimulation, communication strategies for children who have communication disorders in the Early Years, when necessary.
- Consult with other health professionals to develop inter-agency partnerships (e.g., Northern Lights, Sask Rivers School Division, Health Region)
- Deliver professional development to school based teams, including caregivers, on communication disorders and/or communication development strategies.
- Screen Kindergarten students' hearing and articulation; provide strategies to classroom teachers to support areas of need.
- Support EYA (Early Years Assessment) by providing teachers with Tier 1 intervention strategies to increase language and literacy in the classroom; guide teachers to facilitate increased cognitive and language skills through implementation of Tier 2 small groups.
- Administer communication assessments, write assessment reports and conduct meetings to review assessment results and recommendations with caregivers and school staff.
- Consult and contract SLP(s) and Student Services Teachers to prioritize assessments and collaborate with contract SLP(s) to provide recommendations for students assessed by contractor(s).
- Use a variety of formal and informal tests and procedures to assess and identify language, speech, voice, resonance, and fluency disorders.
- Provide consultation and intervention services for students with fluency disorders.
- Educate and counsel clients, families and school staff regarding communication disorders.
- Design and employ augmentative and alternative communication strategies and devices.
- Develop and implement treatment plans for students with articulation delays or disorders.
- Educate and supervise support staff to implement articulation therapy.
- Collaborate with other SLP to support students with Autism utilizing Reference and Regulate therapy.

#### Requirements:

- Masters Degree in Speech Language Pathology.
- Must be a member of and licensed with the Saskatchewan Association of Speech-Language Pathologists and Audiologists (SASLPA).
- Willing to travel extensively to the LLRIB communities.
- Excellent verbal and written communication skills.
- A broad knowledge of child development and teaching methods.
- Cultural sensitivity.
- Ability to speak Cree language would be an asset.
- Ability to recognize individual learning styles and the characteristics of learners.
- Strong working knowledge of Microsoft software, including Word, Excel, etc.
- Ability to provide satisfactory Criminal Record and Vulnerable Sector Check.
- Valid Class 5 driver license.
