

Lac La Ronge Indian Band

Lands Survey Policy
October 15, 2021

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WHEREAS:

- A. Chief and Council of the Lac La Ronge Indian Band is the elected government of Lac La Ronge Indian Band.
- **B.** The function of Chief and Council is to provide good government for LLRIB including making laws, by-laws, and policies, strategic planning, and fiscal management.
- C. To assist Chief and Council in the process of good governance in relation to lands management and development under the Lac La Ronge Indian Band Land Code, Lac La Ronge Indian Band wishes to make a policy confirming the authority and process to cause surveys to be made in relation to Lac La Ronge Indian Band Land, and to confirm the express reliance on supporting laws in relation to surveying.
- **D.** The Land & Resources Department is limited in their powers by the authority delegated to them in this policy by Chief and Council.

Now Therefore Chief and Council of the Lac La Ronge Indian Band hereby enact the following policy:

PART 1 PRELIMINARY MATTERS

1. Name

1.1 This policy is called the Lac La Ronge Indian Band Lands Survey Policy.

2. Definitions

- 2.1 Unless otherwise defined in this policy or required by the context, words and expressions used in this policy have the same meaning as they have been given in the Land Code.
- 2.2 In this policy:

"First Nation Land Register" means the register within the First Nations Land Registry System (FNLRS), set up by section 25(1) of the First Nations Land Management Act, which records instruments relating to reserve lands administered under the First Nations Land Management Act;

"Lands & Resources Department" means that office which provides, among other duties, administrative support to the Land Code Advisory Committee and the Traditional Lands and Resources Advisory Committee and is responsible for managing Lac La Ronge Indian Band Lands under the Land Code; for the purposes of this policy, any delegate of the Lands & Resources Department must be a staff member, such as the Reserve Lands Manager;

"Person" means any natural person, but for the purposes of this policy, also includes any corporate or government entity;

"Survey" or "Surveys" include, but are not limited to, a resurvey, a special survey, an official plan, an administrative plan, and a registration plan, and it to be interpreted broadly;

"Surveyor" means a Canada Lands Surveyor, within the meaning of section 2 of the Canada Lands Surveyors Act; and

"Surveyor General" means a person who is a Canada Lands Surveyor and is appointed as Surveyor General in the manner authorized by law or a person authorized by the Minister to carry out the duties of the Surveyor General.

3. General Interpretation

- 3.1 In this policy:
 - (1) Headings and subheadings are for convenience only, do not form part of this policy, and in no way define, limit, alter, or enlarge the scope or meaning of any provision of this policy;

- Unless the context requires otherwise, the use of the singular is to be construed as including the plural and vice versa;
- (3) Unless the context requires otherwise, a reference to one gender includes reference to all other genders;
- (4) "Must" is to be construed as imperative;
- (5) The words "include", "includes", "including", "exclude", "excludes", and "excluding" are to be read as if they are followed by the phrase "without limitation"; and
- (6) A reference to an enactment includes every amendment to it, every subordinate enactment—including laws, by-laws, and regulations—made under it, and any replacement enactment.
- 3.2 If there is an inconsistency or conflict between this policy and the Land Code, the Land Code prevails to the extent of the inconsistency or conflict.
- 3.3 This policy must be interpreted in a fair, large, and liberal manner and in accordance with the Land Code.

4. Severability

4.1 If any provision of this policy is determined by a court of competent jurisdiction to be illegal or unenforceable, that invalid provision will be considered separate and severable, and the legality or enforceability of the remaining provisions will not be affected by that determination.

5. Application

- 5.1 This policy applies to the whole area of Lac La Ronge Indian Band Land.
- 5.2 Where any other enactment, including a law, by-law or regulation, of Canada or Lac La Ronge Indian Band applies to any matter covered by this policy, compliance with this policy does not relieve any person from also needing to comply with the provisions of other applicable enactments.

PART 2 SURVEYS

6. Authority to instruct Surveys to be made

- 6.1 Lac La Ronge Indian Band Council may cause or allow Surveys to be made of Lac La Ronge Indian Band Land.
- 6.2 Lac La Ronge Indian Band Council expressly appoints the Lands & Resources

Department or its delegate to administer portions of this policy.

6.3 For clarity, all surveys must be made and registered in accordance with the Canada Lands Surveys Act, the Canada Lands Surveyors Act, and the First Nation Land Registry Regulations.

7. Council delegates authority

- 7.1 Specifically, the Lands & Resources Department or its delegate has authority to and:
 - (1) Must receive and review all applications under section 9.1 from any Person seeking a Survey to be made;
 - (2) May request or arrange for a Survey to be made on behalf of Lac La Ronge Indian Band;
 - (3) Must determine the necessity for a Survey and, where applicable, the type of Survey required in any situation;
 - (4) Must determine and document any requirements for registration of the Survey plan as outlined in the *First Nations Land Registry Regulations*;
 - (5) Must prepare any required documents and checks;
 - (6) May hire a Surveyor;
 - (7) May negotiate and enter into funding agreements for Surveys to be made of Lac La Ronge Indian Band Land on behalf of Lac La Ronge Indian Band;
 - (8) Must report regularly to Council on all decisions made by the Lands & Resources Department to allow or deny an application for a Survey to be made under section 9.1;
 - (9) Must provide any Surveyor with confirmation for entry to Lac La Ronge Indian Band Lands in the prescribed format, as set out in Schedule B to this policy;
 - (10) Must review any preliminary or other Survey plan and compare it to the Survey instructions; and
 - (11) May provide recommendations to Council or the Land Code Advisory Committee on whether to approve a Survey plan;
 - (12) May register Survey plans in the First Nation Land Register; and
 - (13) May provide other administrative support as required to support this policy.

8. Authority to approve forms

- 8.1 Council may establish or approve mandatory standards, criteria, forms, and resolutions in relation to this policy, and expressly prescribes the following forms:
 - (1) Survey Application, as prescribed in the form at Schedule A;
 - (2) Confirmation of entry to Lac La Ronge Indian Band Lands to a Surveyor, as prescribed in the form at Schedule B;
 - (3) Land status report, as prescribed in the form at Schedule C;
 - (4) Written approval of Survey plans; and
 - (5) Any procedures necessary to give effect to this policy.

9. Applications

- 9.1 Any Person who is the holder of or interested in obtaining an Interest in Lac La Ronge Indian Band Land, or otherwise wishes to have a Survey be made of any part of Lac La Ronge Indian Band Land, must first apply in the prescribed form set out in Appendix "A" to the Lands & Resources Department.
- 9.2 For certainty, section 9.1 applies to Members and Non-Members.

10. Administrative fees

Council may establish administrative fees

10.1 Council may establish administrative fees in relation to this policy, so to offset the administrative costs for necessary or, if relevant, further requested work by the Lands & Resources Department to process requests made under section 9.1 (i.e., facilitating the hiring of a Surveyor if requested, ensuring the type of Survey is appropriate and meets minimum standards, doing an encumbrance check).

Fee applies to non-Members only

10.2 An administrative fee of \$150 per hour or part thereof is payable by any Person applying for a Survey to be made under section 9.1 who is not a Member of Lac La Ronge Indian Band.

Fee is a debt payable to LLRIB

10.3 The administrative fee is a debt to be invoiced directly to the Person applying for a Survey to be made under section 9.1.

- 10.4 The administrative fee invoiced to the Person must be paid in full to Lac La Ronge Indian Band prior to any issuance of permission for a Surveyor to enter Lac La Ronge Indian Band Land or decision being granted by the Lands & Resources Department or its delegate for a Survey to proceed.
- 10.5 No Person may request a Survey to be made under section 9.1 if they have debt outstanding to Lac La Ronge Indian Band under this policy, and do not have an existing agreement to repay that debt to Lac La Ronge Indian Band.

11. Costs of Survey

Costs borne by applicant

- 11.1 Any Person who applies for a Survey to be made under section 9.1 must pay all applicable costs of having the Survey be made, directly to the Surveyor.
- 11.2 For certainty, Lac La Ronge Indian Band is not liable for costs incurred for any Survey made pursuant to applications under section 9.1.

12. Approval of Surveys to proceed

- 12.1 The Land & Resources Department or its delegate may approve, deny, or request further information in support of a Survey application made under section 9.1 in the prescribed form, as set out in Appendix "A".
- 12.2 Approval under section 12.1 is to:
 - (1) confirm that the proposed Survey is required;
 - (2) confirm that the proposed Survey type is necessary;
 - (3) confirm that all necessary checks have been done by the Lands & Resources Department or its delegate and the proposed Survey may proceed as requested; and
 - (4) confirm that access will be granted and communicated directly to the proposed Surveyor in the prescribed form.
- 12.3 Signature and written approval by the Lands & Resources Department or its delegate on the face of the prescribed form as set out in Appendix "A" constitutes approval under Part 12 of this policy.

13. Approval of Survey Plans

Deemed accuracy

13.1 All Surveys of Lac La Ronge Indian Band Land prepared by the Surveyor General, or the Surveyor that is that person's designate, are to be deemed for all purposes to accurately describe and identify the boundaries of the lands covered by such Survey.

Require Council approval

- 13.2 Council must review and consider for approval any Survey plan, and compare it to the Survey instructions, for any Survey used to create new parcels, including easements, rights-of-way and permit areas, prior to it being submitted to the Surveyor General, and approval is to be for:
 - (1) the creation of any new parcels shown on the Survey plan;
 - (2) that the Survey plan is suitable for the intended transaction; and
 - (3) that the Survey plan meets with any planning or land use requirements of Lac La Ronge Indian Band.
- 13.3 Council approval of Survey plans under section 13.2 may be in any form but must include at a minimum the name(s) and title(s) of the individuals approving the Survey plan on behalf of Council.
- 13.4 Notwithstanding section 13.2, Council may request to review and approve other types of Surveys.

14. First Nation Land Register

- 14.1 All Surveys approved by Council under Part 13 must be registered or recorded in the First Nation Land Register.
- 14.2 The Lands & Resources Department must register all Surveys possible in the First Nation Land Register, even if not necessary under other enactments, to ensure fulsome records are kept.

PART 3 APPEALS

15. Appeals

15.1 A decision by Council not to approve a Survey reviewed by Council under section 13.2 may be appealed under the dispute resolution provisions of the Land Code at Part 8.

PART 4 OTHER MATTERS

16. Distribution of Policy

- 16.1 This policy may be distributed as necessary to Members and non-Members.
- 16.2 For certainty, this policy must be distributed to any Person making a request under section 9.1 in the prescribed form set out in Appendix "A".
- 16.3 This policy must be distributed to the Association of Canada Lands Surveyors, and any Surveyor who may or will enter Lac La Ronge Indian Band Land, to ensure understanding and compliance of Lac La Ronge Indian Band policy and prescribed forms.

17. Date Policy comes into force

17.1 This Policy shall come into force on the date that Chief and Council approve it at a duly convened meeting of Chief and Council.

BE IT KNOWN that this policy entitled Lac La Ronge Indian Band Lands Survey Policy is hereby enacted by a quorum of Council at a duly convened Council of the Lac La Ronge Indian Band held on of and comes into force and effect on the 15 day of other, 2021.
